CCE holds its first Safety Training Day


The CCE Safety Committee organized a Division-wide safety training event, with the assistance of the Caltech Safety Office, for the protection of CCE scientists and resources.

CCE Division's first Safety Training Day took place on November 19th, 2010. The afternoon event was organized by the Division's Safety Committee, whose present chair is Linda Hsieh-Wilson. Available to all students, postdocs and staff scientists in the Division (approximately 460 people), the event's high participation level was very encouraging to the organizers. This event was probably the largest of its kind anywhere on a university campus and really highlighted safety as a first priority for all CCE researchers.

The afternoon started with a safety seminar and panel discussion at the Beckman Auditorium. On the panel were John Bercaw (Chemistry), Richard Flagan (Chemical Engineering), Robert Grubbs (Chemistry), Doug Rees (Chemistry), Sarah Reisman (Chemistry), Caz Scislowicz (Director, EH&S), Scott Virgil (Chemistry), Dan Weitekamp (Chemistry), and Jay Winkler (Chemistry). John Bercaw presented the introductory seminar, explaining the purpose of the event, and giving some details of the sessions to follow. The presentation included subjects such as personal

protective equipment (eye protection, lab coats, gloves, ... etc.), maintaining a safe work environment, Fire Department inspection issues, understanding the hazardous properties of chemicals (MSDS), chemical storage and laboratory housekeeping, and chemical disposal. In this seminar, Bercaw explained the levels responsibility, from individual researchers to the Institute as a whole, and gave examples of how to avoid potentially hazardous situations and how to respond to accidents. The seminar was followed by individual contributions from panel members concerning their areas of expertise.

Six breakout sessions followed the panel discussion, of which each scientist was required to attend three. The sessions included: 1. General Safety: fire extinguishers, emergency showers, 2. Working with Pyrophorics: syringe, cannula, quenching techniques, 3. Liquid Nitrogen and Vacuum/Schlenk Line: hazards/techniques, 4. NMR, Cryogenics, and Laser Safety: hazards/techniques, 5. Biohazards and Sterile Cell Culture Techniques, and 6. Ergonomics: computer ergonomics, lab bench ergonomics. Hands-on training on safety equipment such as fire extinguishers was also provided.

The event concluded with a Division-wide social with refreshments served in the Beckman Institute courtyard.
